Dr Emomotimi John Agama is the Director-General of the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), Nigeria's apex capital market regulator, appointed in April 2024.

A distinguished economist, financial analyst, and chartered management accountant, he brings over three decades of experience in capital market regulation, financial strategy, and institutional leadership. Dr. Agama holds a PhD in Economics from Nile University of Nigeria, a Graduate Certificate in Capital Markets from George Washington University, and dual Master's degrees from the University of Benin. He is a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA, UK), a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Stockbrokers (FCIS), and a Fellow of the IFC–Milken Institute Capital Markets Program.

Since joining the SEC in 2004, he has held several senior roles, including Managing Director of the Nigerian Capital Market Institute (NCMI) and Head of Market Infrastructure and Innovation. Internationally, he currently serves as Vice Chairman of the Africa/Middle East Regional Committee (AMERC) of IOSCO.

Under his leadership, the SEC is driving an agenda centred on digitalisation, smart regulation, youth inclusion, and investor protection, positioning Nigeria's capital market as a competitive hub for fintech and sustainable investment.

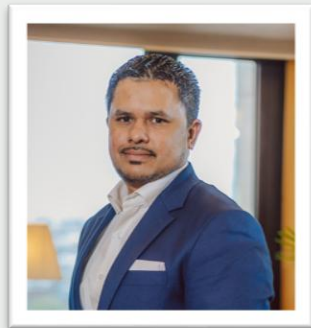
